Location 1 Premises:

The premises are sited in an office building which was fitted out as a ground floor Health Centre in 2009. Hanover House is on a busy industrial estate which is surrounded by the densely populated area of Cressex, High Wycombe. It has good walking, parking and bus access. There is suitable disabled access and a lift to reach the 1st floor. The building is safe and accessible and provides surroundings that promote wellbeing. The building is adequately serviced and maintained and is a clean and safe environment.

We have a dedicated reception area, clinical rooms and admin rooms. Under the NHS transformation fund (ETTD) we are hoping to renovate the ground floor to clearly define clinical and non-clinical areas of work, create a more patient-friendly reception area and create a learning and information hub for patients and external agencies to meet and share information and services.

Premises:

Lynton House is a detached house which was originally a family residence. In 1990 the premises were fitted out as a GP Practice, including a ground floor extension and consists of two floors, with five clinical rooms, waiting area, reception area and admin rooms of varying size on the ground floor.

A public consultation was held in 2016 to close Lynton House as it was deemed by both staff and the CQC as being unsafe for the provision of primary care services. The consultation results showed public suport for keeping Lynton House open and NHS England and the CCG agreed funding to enable the refurbishment that was completed in March 2018. The retention of Lynton House means that a vital GP service is maintained in the east of Wycombe, where there is limited coverage. Lynton House now has a smaller footprint but is clean, modern, safe and since rated 'good' by CQC.

Cressex prides itself on the ability to already offer patients a varied skill mix of clinical and non-clinical personnel. There are currently 24 established posts with only current 3 x vacancies which lay within the reception team.

- 1 x Clinical Lead (GP), 2 x substantive GP's (in total 2 x male and 1 x female) offering up to 32 sessions per week
- 1 x Nurses (prescriber/minor illness)
- 1 x PA (Physician's Associate)
- 1 x ECP (Emergency Care Practitioner)
- 1 x HCA/Phlebotomist
- 1 x Clinical Pharmacist (shared with WVS)
- 1 x Practice Manger, 1 x IT Manager, 1 x Reception Manager
- 14 additional non-clinical staff; 1 x Medical Secretary, 1 x Workflow Manager, 1 x Clinical Assistant, 1 X Admin Assistant, 1 x Administration/Deductions Officer, 9 x Receptionists.

Service Delivery

The majority of the clinical services operate from the main site where the floor space is 502 m2 and currently (pre refurbishment) accommodates 8 clinical rooms and three administration rooms. There is a very large reception area and waiting room. There are five patient toilets (two male, two female and one disabled).

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The staff at Cressex work hard to maximise all income offerings against targets included in QOF, PCDS, Enhanced Services and Public Health services. Year on year Cressex has strived to improve upon its service delivery in QOF and PCDS and the success is evidenced in the marked improvements in patient care equating to points and monetary gain. Clinical staff have undertaken training in joint injections and LARC services and now regularly hold clinics and specific non-clinicians have been trained to carry out phlebotomy, diabetes seven point health checks and standard national health checks thus easing capacity on the nursing team.
