


Prescribing of over the counter medicines is changing

Your GP or Nurse will not generally give you a prescription for over the counter medicines for a range of minor health concerns. Instead, these are available to buy in a pharmacy or supermarket in your local community. The qualified health professionals at your local pharmacy can offer clinical advice to safely and effectively manage minor health concerns.

MMR VACCINE

Is your child up to date?

MMR is a safe and effective combined vaccine that protects against 3 separate illnesses – measles, mumps and rubella (German measles) – in a single injection. The full course of MMR vaccination requires 2 doses.

Measles, mumps and rubella are highly infectious conditions that can have serious, potentially fatal complications, including meningitis, swelling of the brain (encephalitis) and deafness.

Since the MMR vaccine was introduced in 1988, it is rare for children in the UK to develop these serious conditions, but outbreaks happen and there have been cases of measles in recent years, so it's important to make sure that you and your children are up-to-date with the MMR vaccination.

SHINGLES VACCINATION

If you are aged between 70 and 80 and have not had your shingles vaccination, please ask at reception to see if you are eligible to have this.
